The following items are accepted from residents for free at Washington County's Environmental Center in Woodbury. Items listed are examples only. Call or visit the website for more information.

Hazardous Materials Accepted



Home Improvement & Construction:

- Latex paint
- Oil-based paint
- Paint remover/stripper/thinner
- Stain/varnish



Yard & Garden:

- Insect/roach/ant killer
- Fertilizers/pesticides/weed killer



Household Items:

- Aerosol cans
- Mercury thermometers and thermostats
- Fluorescent bulbs
- Some household cleaners (*check label for words "Caution", "Warning", "Danger", "Poison"*)



Automotive & Recreation

- Antifreeze
- Used motor oil and filters
- Propane tanks
- Rechargeable batteries

Electronics Accepted



- Computers
- Computer monitors
- Peripherals (keyboards, mice, speakers, etc.)
- Printers
- TVs
- DVD & VCR Players
- Fax Machines
- Cell phones

Recyclables Accepted

Small loads of recyclables are also accepted from businesses for free.

Curbside recycling is offered in all cities and townships in Washington County. Contact your recycler or waste hauler for collection details.

Paper:

- Mail, office and school papers
- Magazines and catalogs
- Newspapers and inserts
- Phone books
- Corrugated cardboard
- Boxboard (like cereal boxes, cracker boxes, boxes from toothpaste, and other toiletries)

Metal:

- Metal food and beverage cans

Glass:

- Glass food and beverage bottles and jars

Plastic:

- Plastic bottles with a neck marked or



Instructions

- Transport items in a paper bag, cardboard box, or plastic tote and put them in the trunk away from children.
- Arrange bottles and cans in a single layer, upright and sealed. Paint cans may be double-stacked.
- All containers must be sealed with a tight lid or cap.
- Label materials that are not in their original containers.
- Bundle fluorescent tubes with rubber bands. Please don't tape.
- Oil, antifreeze, and gas containers may be returned for reuse—put in a clearly marked container, no more than ¾ full.
- Place a piece of tape over contacts for rechargeable batteries to avoid sparking.



Don't do this:

- **Do not put your items in a plastic bag.** Use a box or a grocery-style paper bag to keep bottles and cans arranged and upright.
- **Do not mix or combine chemicals!** Pouring chemicals together can be dangerous and prevents recycling.
- **No empties.** Empty containers may be placed in the trash.
